A RELIGIOUS AND HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE ON JEWISH BURIAL

In 1960, as published in the Reform Responsa, Dr. Solomon Freehof explained that "burial in ancient Israel was more like mausoleum burial than earth burial. People were buried in niches in rocky caves. The patriarchs and matriarchs were buried in the Cave of Machpela, and all later legends depict them as lying on their beds, not as covered with earth.

"The Mishna carefully describes the arrangement of niches in a cave. It was in Babylon, where there were no rocky caves that the custom developed to bury exclusively in the earth. The law soon showed a preference for such burial" - Rabbi Dr. Solomon Freehof
